Transcript for chapter 1 of 10: Before ABI

Kerrie: Now, my life before my injury was actually incredibly full. That was because I'm the type of person to always jam four or five hours of stuff into two or three.

Delia and Cassandra: I had three children, who were 3, 7, and 9. They all had their various sporting activities and school activities and I used to work casually in the local hospital, which was just down the road. There were lots of other things. Very hectic.

Paul: I was a successful businessman. I employed 10 people in my own nursery and gardening business.

Igal, Anat, Illana: Anat was a very social butterfly – very, very. Friends were something that was very important to her and she had lots of friends.

Peter and Carol: Prior to the brain injury, I'd been employed by Nissan, at the casting plant, as a production group leader. I then left there, and had started my own business. I was self-employed.
